

## **INFORMED DECISIONS. STREAMLINED PROCESSES. BETTER STUDENT OUTCOMES.**

In California, 31 math programs and 25 ELA/ELD programs have been adopted by the State Board of Education. Districts are also permitted to select “off list” materials. How do districts make the right choice of instructional materials for their students? Districts need help evaluating the landscape of curricular materials, evaluating them based on standards alignment, material quality, and other factors.
